

# COED POLICIES

## Season 11

**In addition to its rules, COED will have the following set of policies, which will be revisited at the beginning of each new season.**

### **Section 1. League Fees and Deadlines**

- A. League fees will consist of the following;
  - 1. Association Membership fees of \$15 per person, which will be a one-time fee for anyone wishing to join the association. Association membership is required to compete in ADDA leagues.
  - 2. Player fees of \$20 per player on each team's roster.
  - 3. Bar fees of \$10 per team.
- B. Mystery Out fees (which are voluntary) of \$1 per week of the regular season.
- C. Additional late fees will apply if fees are not paid or postmarked by the deadline. The total fees with late charges will be -- \$25 for the bar fee, \$30 for the player fee, \$25 for the association fee and \$20 for the Mystery Out fee.
- D. Player and bar fees must be submitted by Thursday, March 13th at 8 PM, Mystery Out fees are due by Thursday, March 20th at 8 PM. Fees may be submitted to any COED league Board Members, mailed with a postmark by the 13th to ADDA, C/O Dacey Hartsfield at 1046 Ormewood Ave SE, Atlanta, GA 30316 or paid through [www.PayPal.com](http://www.PayPal.com) using the email address [addarts@mindspring.com](mailto:addarts@mindspring.com) \*. Checks should be made payable to ADDA or Atlanta Decatur Dart Association.  
**\*When using PayPal, players should include an additional \$.05 (five cent) per dollar processing fee. To avoid this fee, send money to "friends and family" and ensure that your checking account is linked to your paypal account.\***
- E. If bar fees are not submitted by the deadline, each team from that bar must forfeit their match(es) until fees are submitted. Players not submitting their fees to their team captain by the deadline cannot participate in a match until player fees are submitted.
- F. Captains are responsible for making sure their bars have paid the bar fee (and player fees if applicable).

### **Section 2. Mystery Out**

- A. Per ADDA rules (see Rules, section XI, part H), a mystery out number will be pulled each week and if there is no winner, the pot will carry over to the following week until the number matches at least one player's out for that week.
- B. If there is a balance at the end of the season, a guaranteed winner will receive the remaining balance at the end of the Blind Draw Tournament on Super Saturday. At the tournament, all season Mystery Out participants will have their name placed in the drawing one time for participating in the blind draw, then again for each out they hit during the Super Saturday Blind Draw, regardless of the number of times the out has been hit or the number of outs that player hits. One name will be drawn after the tournament and that player wins the pot.
- C. Players in divisions with off weeks due to an odd number of division opponents or on teams who win by forfeit may have their outs carry over from the previous week for their off week(s).

# COED POLICIES

## Season 11

### Section 3. 501 Average Champions

- A. The 501 Average Champion for both the women and the men from each division (if applicable) will be the player with the highest 501 Average that has competed in at least a majority of the season's 501 games during the regular season for all divisions.

### Section 5. Bars, Teams and Divisions

- G. The bars and teams approved for participation in current season may participate in subsequent seasons without an approval vote unless a team or bar is voted out of the league or did not receive a full league vote prior to the start of the season.
- H. Bars for Season 11 will include – Augustine's, Elder Tree Public House, Euclid Avenue Yacht Club, Midtown Tavern, Midway Pub, Milltown Arms, Trackside Tavern, and Twain's Billiards and Tap.
- I. Teams will include – Army of Dartness, Chili con Queso, Don't Fuck with Carol, French Toast Mafia, Hell to the Lell, Just the One?, Piece of Work, Power & Pipes, Simply Irresistibull, Straight Gay, Team Jeter, and The Juggalos.

### Section 6. Dart Boards and Throwing Lines

- A. ADDA will supply boards to all participating teams.
- B. Captains and alternate captains are responsible for bringing their board to each match. ADDA boards are not to be left at the bars. ADDA boards should not remain on the wall for non-ADDA patron use. Teams will be responsible for replacing damaged boards resulting from non-ADDA bar patron use.
- C. Per ADDA rules, all bars must have league-approved throwing lines.

### Section 7. Match Result Submission

If scores are not submitted within the 48-hour period following the match, a penalty will be assessed of a one-point deduction from the home team's win total for each 24 hour period that the results are not reported after the initial 48-hour period. The ADDA Board may make exceptions to this rule for extenuating circumstances.

### Section 8. Regular Season

- A. Season 11 will begin March 13th and will consist of 11 weeks of competition along with two make-up weeks, with the regular season conclusion on June 5<sup>th</sup>.
- B. "Division Champions" will be the regular season first place team.

### Section 9. Final Division Standings Tie-Breakers

- A. In the event of a tie within a division, the team that has the better head-to-head record will be determined to be the winner/higher-placed team. In the event the two teams are still tied, the team that scored most away points in head-to-head matchups will be the winner/higher-placed team. In the event the two teams are still tied, a coin will be flipped to determine the winner/higher-placed team.

### Section 10. Post-Season Tournaments and Super Saturday

- A. There will be one post-season tournament.
- B. Teams will compete in a single elimination bracket seeded by random draw.

- C. Round one of the tournaments will take place on **Thursday, June 12th** at the home bar of the teams with the higher points per week average. If there are two matches in the same bar involving teams with equal averages in each tournament and the bar cannot accommodate both matches, then the ADDA President will determine which team will play at their home bar. The other team will play at their opponent's bar or a neutral site with the choice made by the ADDA President. For matches played on a neutral site, the "visiting" team will be the team with the highest points per week average.
- D. The final rounds will be played on **Super Saturday on June 14th.**
  - a. The "visiting teams" on Super Saturday will be the teams with the higher points per week average, and will have the advantage of choice on the cork. The ADDA President will determine the boards on which all Super Saturday matches will be played. If the ADDA President's team is playing in the tournament, all members of the Board who are present and are not currently playing in the tournament will determine the boards on which matches will be played.
- E. The winner of the tournament will be crowned League Champions and have "possession" of the COED Trophy and will receive a cash prize.
- F. Following the COED Tournament, there will be a blind draw tournament which will determine the winner of any remaining Mystery Out funds for the season.

### Section 11. ADDA Tax Liability

- A. Because ADDA is a corporation, the Association must follow state and federal guidelines for prize money paid to its members or participants in ADDA sponsored events. Any player winning \$600 or more during a calendar year will receive a copy of IRS Form 1099 with the exact dollar amount of prize money awarded for the year, which will be filed with the IRS. Please consult your tax advisor for advice on accounting for any amount reported to the IRS by ADDA. ADDA is not required to report any amount \$599 or below.
